

PREVENTION AND POST ADOPTION GRANTS AWARDED

(Albany) The New York State Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) has selected the awardees for the 2011-12 Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Prevention and Post Adoption grants.

A total of \$14.4 million was made available to support projects serving families at high risk of child abuse or maltreatment and/or foster care or out-of-home placements, residing in high need communities. The one-year grants are targeted to TANF eligible families under 200% of the poverty level and are aligned to priorities of local social services districts.

Out of a total of 106 applications, 49 were selected for funding. These programs cover a wide range of service needs including primary prevention, supervised visitation, intensive comprehensive prevention, kinship services, foster care diversion and regional adoption centers.
